

A LOOK AT THE \$10 MILLION GRANT TO COLORADO COLLEGE BY THE NUMBERS:

El Pomar Foundation has now approved grants to Colorado College totaling \$39,619,363, more than any other organization in El Pomar's 70-year history.

- **144** (Number of grants approved by El Pomar Foundation Trustees to Colorado College, making Colorado College 2nd on the list of total number of grants awarded to an organization. Penrose St. Francis tops the list with 261.)
- **\$30.6 million** (Value of the largest grant made by the Trustees, which went to the Colorado Springs World Arena. The recently approved \$10 million grant to Colorado College is the *second-largest single grant* in El Pomar history.)
- **\$1 million** (Last El Pomar capital grant to Colorado College. It went to renovate Palmer Hall.)

El Pomar's largest grants to Colorado College prior to 2007 include:

- \$5 million in 1984 to rebuild Rastal Center
- \$5 million in 1998 for the Russell T. Tutt Science Center
- \$1.5 million in 1989 for a capital campaign
- \$1.5 million in 1978 for Charles L. Tutt Scholarships
- \$1.3 million in 1968 for the El Pomar Sports Center
- \$1 million in 1973 to establish an endowment fund for scholarships for minority students
- \$771,993 in 1962 to construct the Tutt Library

El Pomar has been a significant supporter of Colorado College's hockey program. Since 1992, El Pomar has made grants totaling \$3,625,000 to Colorado College to support hockey scholarships and the hockey program.

Nearly one-third of all grants made since the Foundation was established in 1937 have gone to support education:

- ✓ 2,441 total grants (30%)
- ✓ \$116,948,436 total grant dollars (32%)

Other significant El Pomar education grants since 1937 include:

- \$4.5 million in 1970 to University of Denver for the Penrose Library
- \$4 million in 1998 to University of Colorado at Colorado Springs for the El Pomar Center and a communications and technology building
- \$3.15 million in 1990 to University of Colorado at Colorado Springs for development of the Colorado Institute for Technology Transfer and Implementation
- \$2 million in 1995 to University of Denver for the El Pomar Natatorium
- \$1.15 million in 2002 to University of Colorado at Colorado Springs for the Beth El College of Nursing
- \$500,000 in 2006 to University of Denver for the renovation of the Penrose Library
- \$500,000 in 2000 to Johnson and Wales University for renovation and expansion of facilities

In 2007, El Pomar has approved 176 grants in support of education, totaling \$12,547,800. In addition to the \$10 million grant approved for Colorado College, other major education grants this year include:

- \$100,000 to Aims Community College for the Allied Health and Science Building
- \$250,000 to University of Colorado at Boulder for the Quigg Newton Endowed Chair Leadership Fund
- \$100,000 to University of Colorado at Boulder for the Wolf Law Building and an El Pomar Endowment Scholarship for rural Colorado students
- \$100,000 to Johnson and Wales University for renovation and restoration of facilities
