They cared about the Colorado Springs community and developed many of our local attractions, inspiring people from all over the world to visit Colorado Springs.



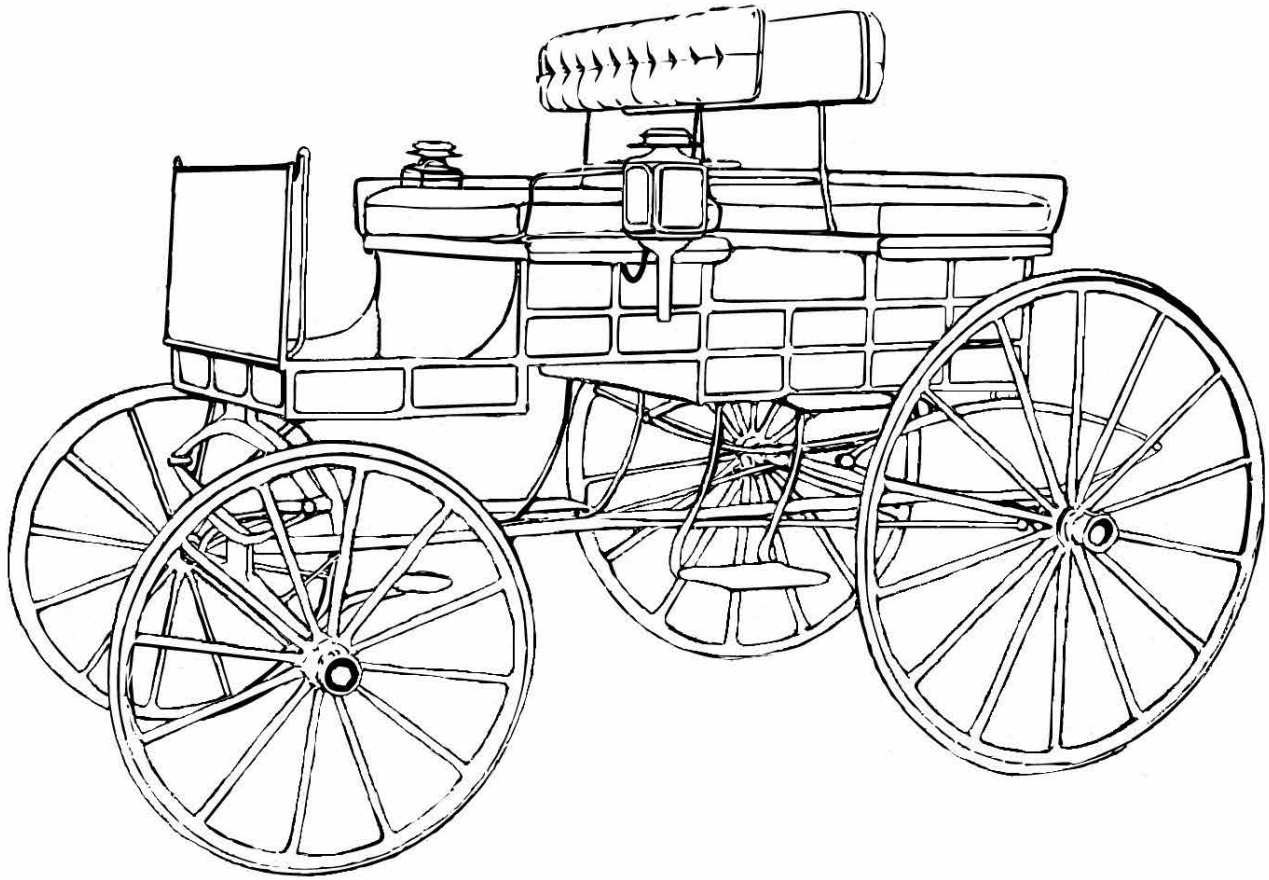

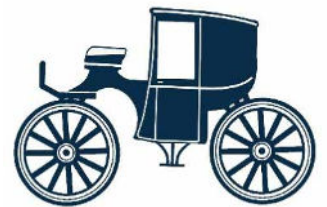
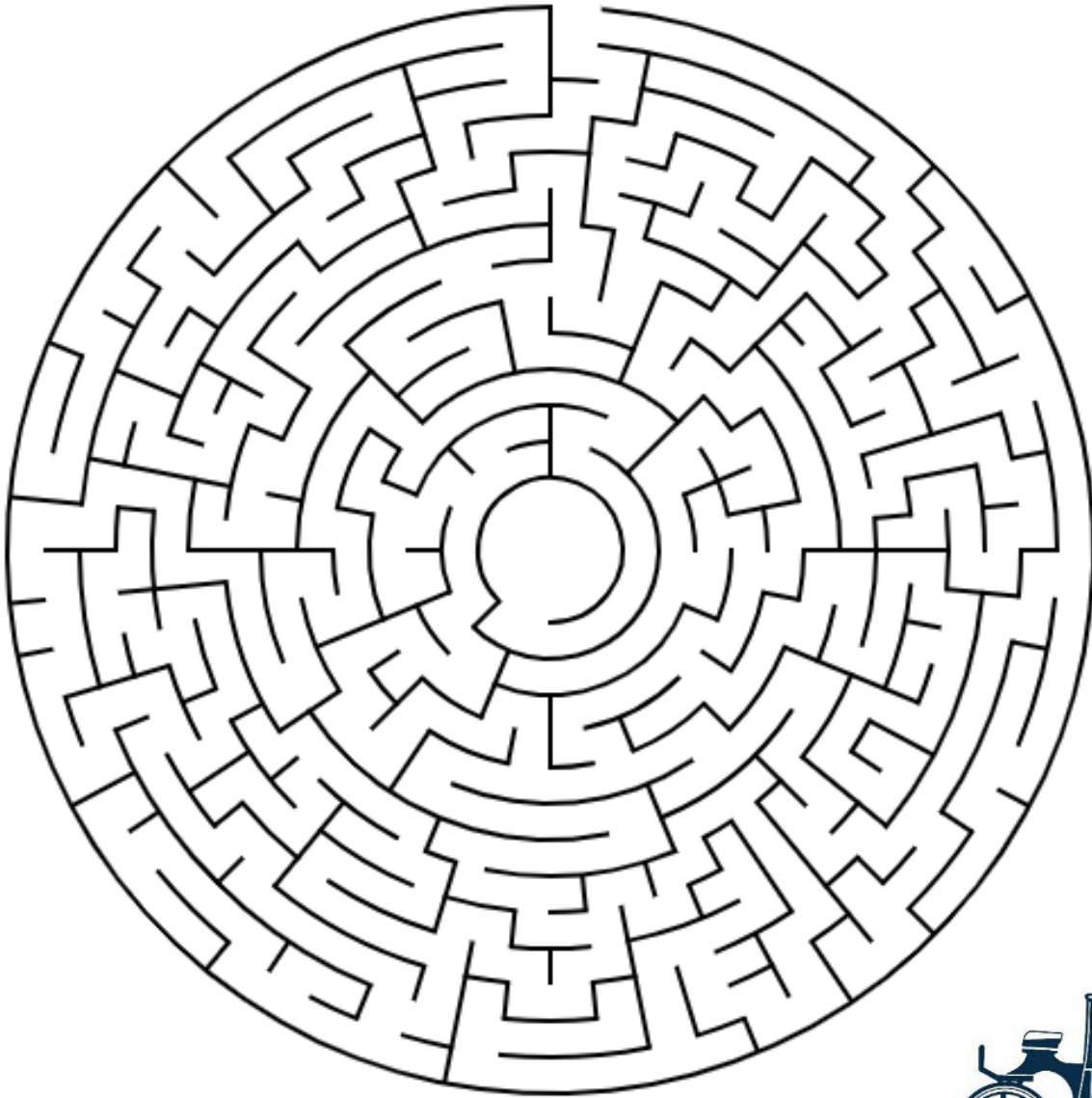
Decorate the Carriage for the Carnival!

Carriage Gallery Maze



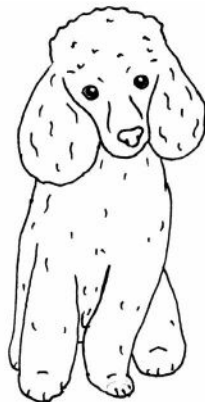
There are 30 carriages on display at Penrose Heritage Museum.

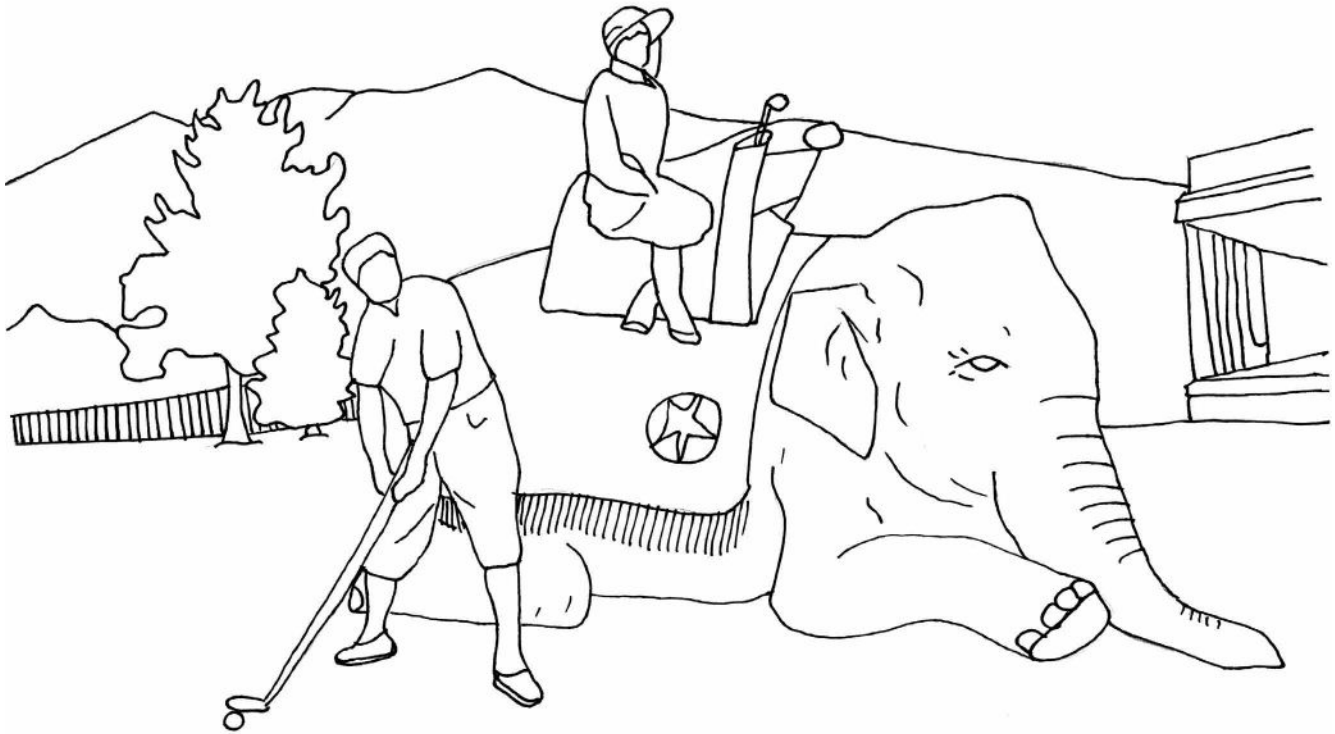

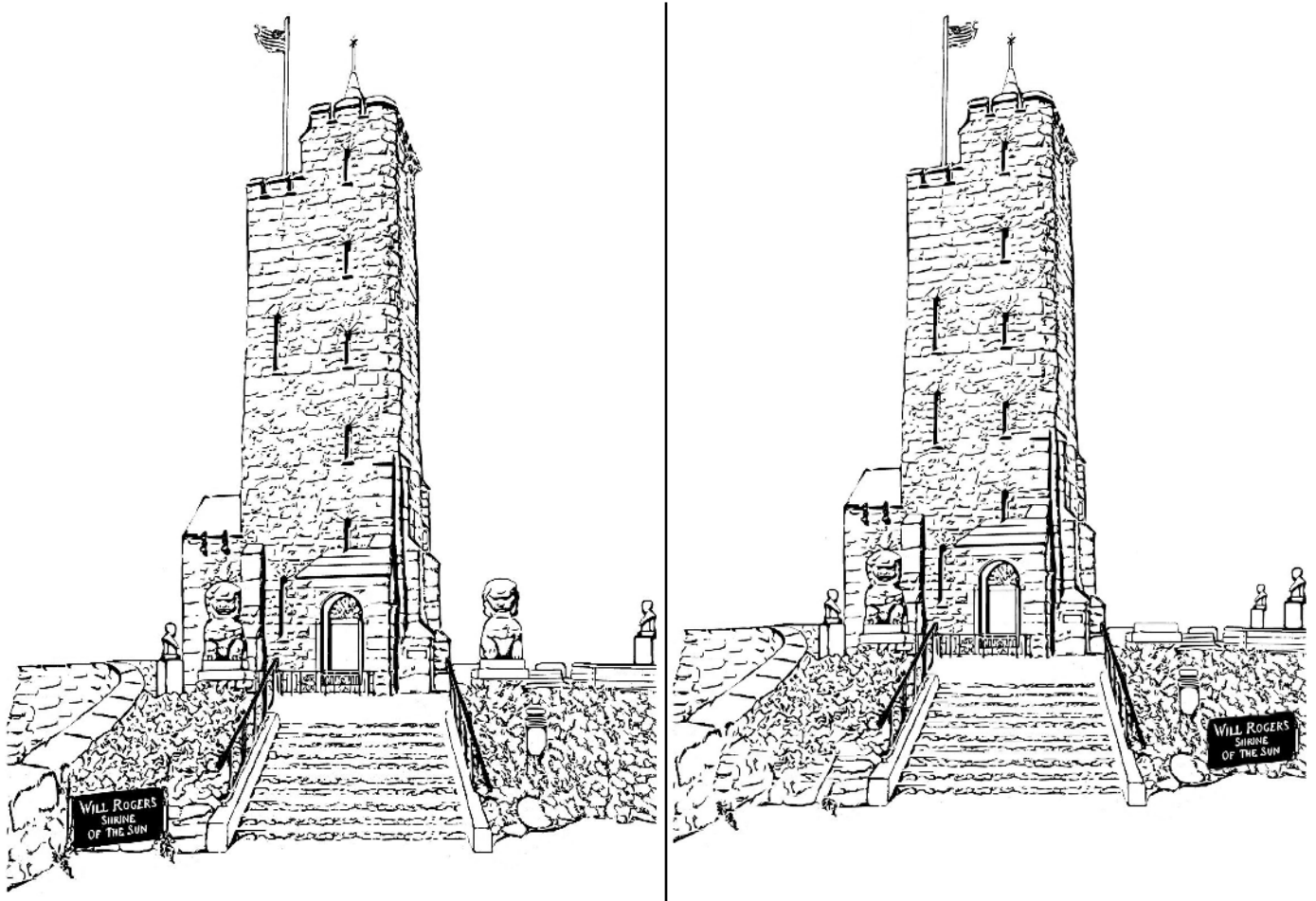


Tessie the elephant arrived in Colorado Springs in April of 1926 and was renowned for her “golf caddy” skills at The Broadmoor hotel.

Spencer had a miniature cog train built to take hotel guests from The Broadmoor to the zoo. It was named the “Zoo Special.”



Will Rogers Shrine of the Sun Spot the Difference!



Will Rogers Shrine of the Sun was built in 1937, just above Cheyenne Mountain Zoo.

The Shrine is the final resting place of Spencer and Julie, who dedicated the tower to famous actor, Will Rogers.

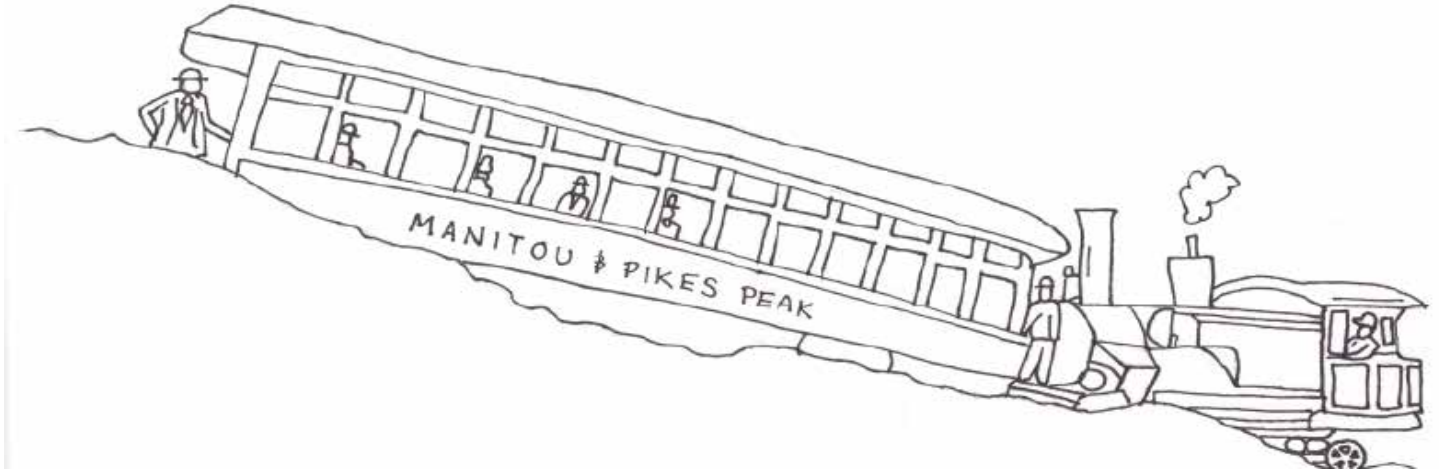
The Broadmoor Coloring Page

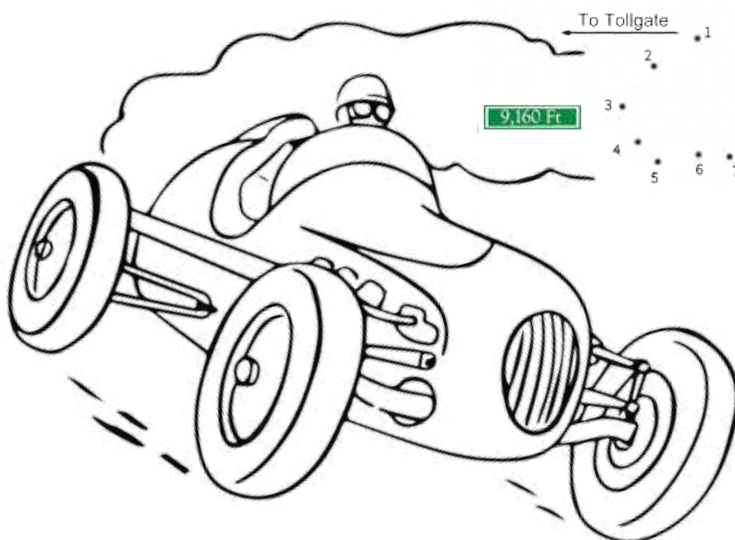
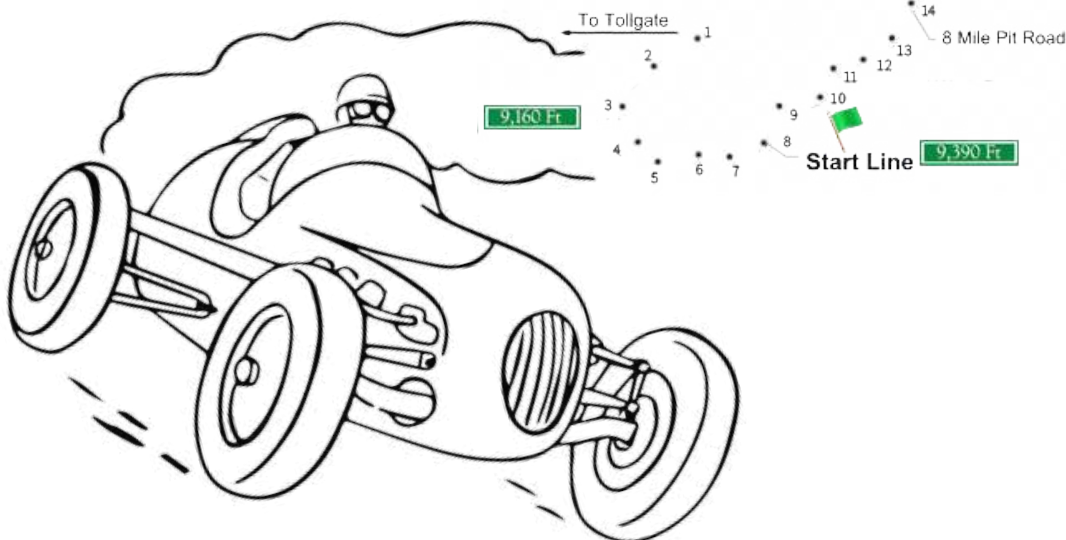
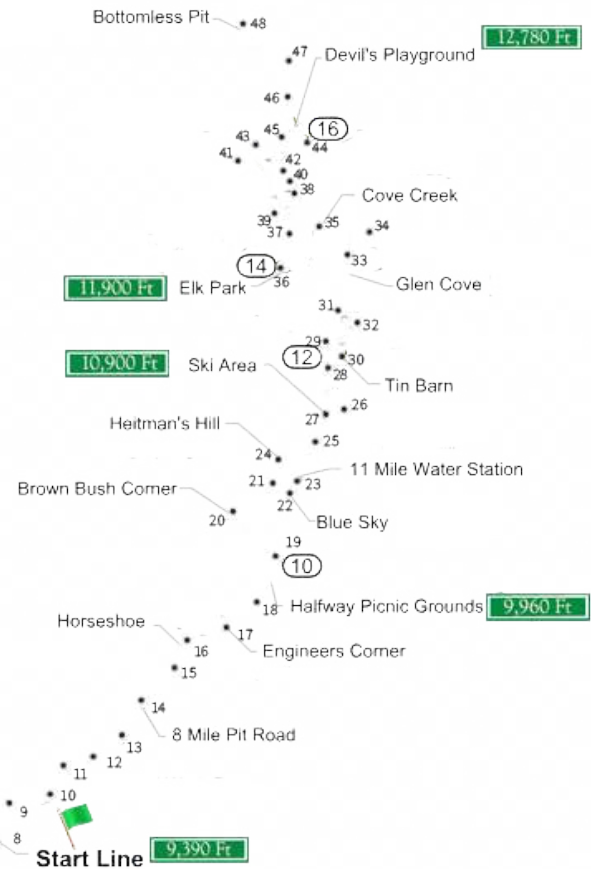
Race to the Clouds

Connect-the-Dots

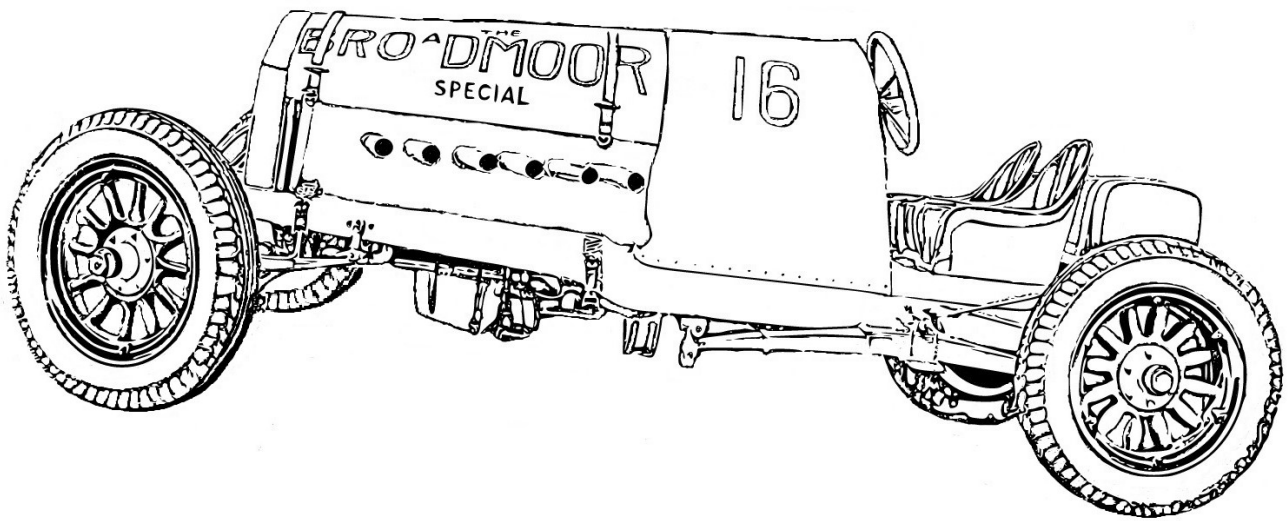


This unique race includes 156 turns in its 4,720-foot elevation gain and 12.42-mile course!

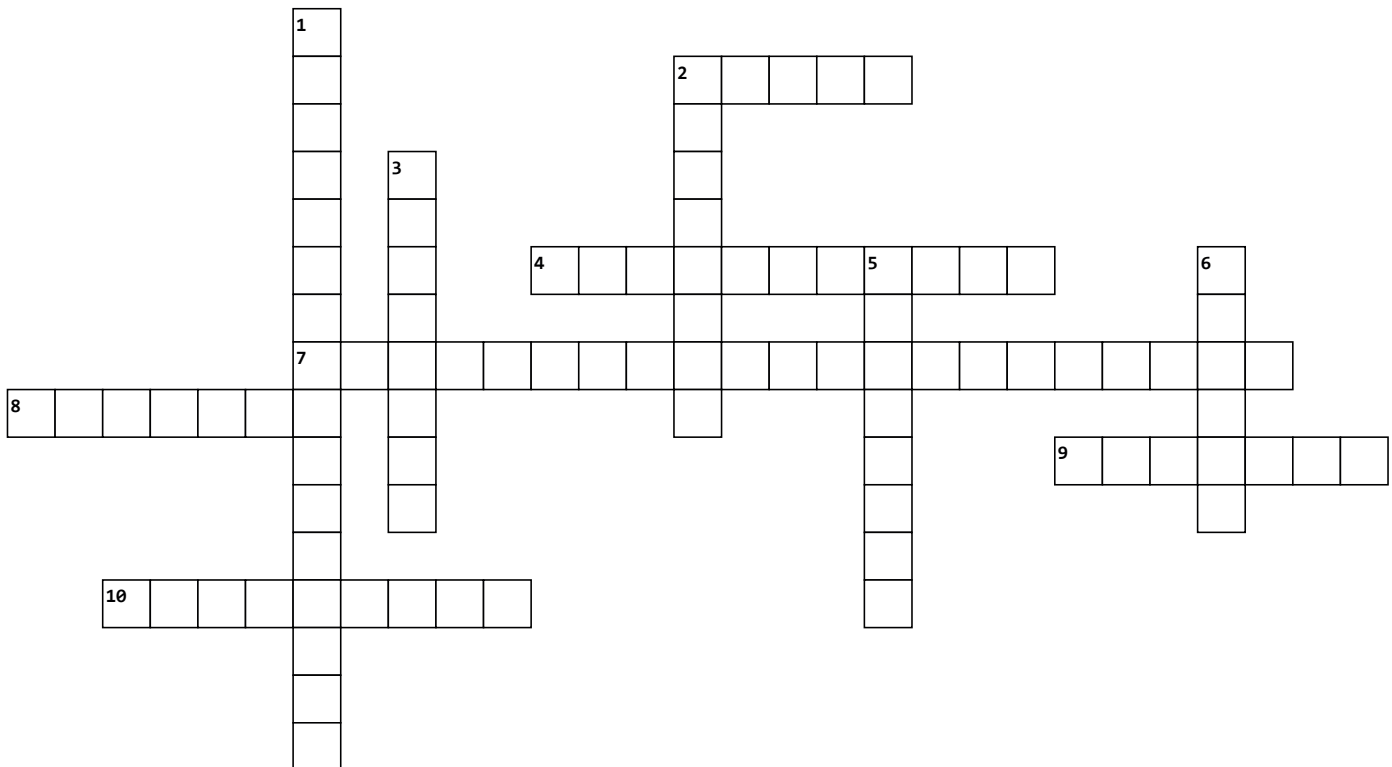
